

Obtaining Evidence of Vaccinations for Health Care Workers and Students

Evidence of Vaccinations

Evidence is recommended to be presented on the [NSW Health Vaccination for Health Care Workers and Students](#), and include the following:

- Name of vaccine
- Date given (full date DD/MM/YYYY)
- Batch No. (where possible)
- Name & Signature of Vaccine Provider (must be in each section)
- Practice Stamp from where the vaccine was given

Please note: the assessor must be satisfied that the evidence is from a legitimate source. Any vaccinations in a foreign language need to be translated using the free translating service [website](#) by Dept Home Affairs or using a local translating service

COVID Vaccination:

Only an Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) – Immunisation History Statement OR COVID-19 Digital certificate is an acceptable form of evidence.

Overseas COVID vaccine certificates cannot be accepted. Students from overseas who do not have Medicare need to follow the process to obtain an Individual Healthcare Identifier Number and see a Health Care Provider that can enter their COVID vaccination records onto AIR. Evidence of Serology

- Original serology reports are the best source of information
- Exact transcription of results onto the Vaccination Card by an Authorised Vaccine Provider. Results must be recorded as numerical values or 'Positive/Negative' or Detected/Not Detected as appropriate
- Rubella will require the numerical result **AND** the pathologist's interpretation of the result (i.e. immunity status) e.g. Positive, Negative, Low Positive- booster required

Where to find records - sources of information

- Vaccination Record Card for Health Workers and Students – with personal details completed
- VaxLink records (if employed by NSW Health)
- Baby Blue Book (if born in Australia)
- Childhood vaccination records from birth country
- The Australian Immunisation Register for immunisation records after 1996- available through MyGov
- Your family General Practitioner (GP) may be a good source of vaccination records
