Fay received the award after being nominated by the hospital's Director of Clinical Services Dr Pauline Rumma, and Dr Justin Playfair, Head of the Eye Department, SSEH.

Dr Rumma said: "Fay has made an outstanding contribution to SSEH through her work for the hospital. She really cares for the experience that people have at the hospital by being warm, compassionate and friendly to all who come here. She is a real inspiration."
