Priority communities in this context are those who require services or support related to the Prevention and Response to Violence, Abuse and Neglect (PARVAN), First 2000 Days and Towards Zero Suicides. A Future State Workshop was facilitated with key partner agencies to understand the challenges with current journeys and service provision and collaboratively design future state journeys and as a result deliver improved outcomes for our priority communities.
