	Item 5	Childhood Obesity – Next Steps			
		Committee members were asked to provide some input into the document 'A collaborative approach to childhood obesity.'			
		The following key points were noted: - A number of challenging issues raised concerning GPs having the difficult conversations with their patients regarding obese / overweight children The Primary Health Network noted that GPs are provided with a wide range of resources to address this issue. Online support is also available for families.			
		Local Council concerns: - Lack of sporting facilities, parks to meet the demands of consumers if all children participated in organised sport - Alternative options are being developed, e.g. non-competitive sporting			
		environments, example given of Fairfield Council experience			
		Live Life Well School Program for primary aged children has 86% participation rate across the State. The Eat Smart, Play Smart manual was developed with the support of Heart			
		Foundation NSW for Our of School Hours Care centres/facilities – this program will be rolled out across NSW in 2018.			
		An alarming 25% of children are considered overweight before they commence primary school.			
		Breakfast programs, often run by volunteers, which focus on knowledge and cooking skills development were discussed and are implemented in certain settings especial where in disadvantaged areas. Jamie Oliver's program is also implemented in some parts of Sydney. GG stated that children who have been the subject to abuse tend to binge.			
		The first 1000 days of life are important to focus on as well and the early childcare settings are an important setting due to this.			
		More needs to be done in the before and after school care settings
