	Item 5	Loneliness & Social Isolation		
		Presentation by Amanda Justice – Community Partnerships Manager		
		The following key points were noted:		
		Living alone does not always mean individuals are lonely		



 Evidence suggests that social isolation/loneliness can result in a higher likelihood of premature mortality and other poorer health and wellbeing indicators

#### Feedback received and tabled so far:

- City of Sydney & SESLHD Board:
  - Men's contact group run out of GP surgery waiting room
  - Social isolation is a current priority area with City of Sydney; particular interest in LGBTQI & aged community

#### Current SESLHD Initiatives:

• What Matters to You – a tool used for all new admissions, which may be able to identify and help address social isolation and loneliness

#### **CESPHN**

- Has received budget to commission services to address social isolation

NSW Ambulance – Special interest in prevention and aged care assessment teams have been established.

#### Challenges:

- finding the individuals who are in the home they tend not to leave their residences
- people can be socially isolated within residential aged care settings
- children in care can be socially isolated
- not only limited to the aged population
- · measuring social isolation
- involving young people, there are a lack of volunteer opportunities for young people and cyber bullying is an issue
- cultural isolation

#### Initiatives across our agencies:

- Quarterly lunch concerts
- · Meals on wheels in conjunction with in the home library
- Befriending groups
- Community 'pop in' space
- Noted St Vincent de Paul contribute a lot in the area of loneliness
- Noted Beyond Blue have interventions at the individual level
- Online community groups
- NSW police door knocking initiative in public housing areas

#### Discussion points:

- Develop some local strategies and programs Councils, PHN and other community partners
- Potential priority areas e.g. youth under 25yrs and aging population over 65yrs
- Broader coordination / approach strategy is required

#### Action

- NSW Education to brief Committee on school perspective
- Community Partnerships Unit to undertake mapping of initiatives across the sector and ascertain key gaps for action
- Community Partnerships Unit to contact NSW Education, CESPHN, NSW Ambulance to ascertain what is happening in this area
