HIV/AIDS and Related Programs (HARP) Unit - South Eastern Sydney Local Health District (SESLHD)

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Background

South Eastern Sydney Local Health District (SESLHD) has a wide range of population health programs and services largely located within the Directorate of Planning Population Health and Equity (DPPHE). The Directorate's Equity Strategy outlines how our services and programs will respond to its key population's health priorities needs and aligns with the District's overarching Journey to Excellence Strategy 2018-2021 and the State and Commonwealth Strategies.

A key strategy for the HIV and Related Programs (HARP) Unit, which sits within the DPPHE, is the NSW HIV Strategy released in December 2015. The Strategy's goals and targets work towards the virtual elimination of HIV transmission by 2020. As the South Eastern Sydney Local Health District, (SESLHD) NSW has approximately 40% of the population living with or seeking treatment for HIV within its borders, SESLHD's response to the challenge requires a coordinated approach and support from its Chief Executive (CE), the Directorate, and the HIV and Sexual Health Service Directors to work with the HARP Unit. In order to meet the ambitious targets set by the Ministry of Health, each Local Health District is asked to supply ongoing HIV testing and treatment data on a quarterly basis. This includes: (1) number of HIV tests; and, (2) data on CD4 count and antiretroviral treatment

From July 2017, only WebNAP activity data from HIV and STI services is collected by NSW Ministry of Health (MoH). The HARP Unit Informatics team manages the performance and activity data for The Albion Centre, Prince of Wales Hospital HIV Infectious Diseases Unit, Sydney Sexual Health Centre, the Kirketon Road Centre, HIV Outreach Team, St George Waratah Clinic and St George Short St Clinic. Although data collection requires monthly reporting, the performance data continues to be reported on a quarterly basis. The HARP data report is produced bi-annually

Objective

This report presents: (1) SESLHD HARP services progression in meeting the aims of the NSW HIV Strategy and performance measures set by NSW Health; (2) the number of patients accessing HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) in SESLHD; (3) eMR CH WebNAP activity data reported to the SESLHD Business Intelligence Unit (BIEU) for Activity Based Management (ABM). The data is also used locally to provide analysis of SESLHD HARP services performance and tabled at the SES LHD HIV and Sexual Health Steering Committee meeting; and, (4) Occasions of Service and number of clients by each service.

Scope

Section 1 of the report covers SESLHD HARP services. Section 2 covers pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) in SESLHD. Section 3 covers seven services from SESLHD; one service from ISLHD and one service from St Vincent's Health Network. Section 4 covers individual reports on all nine services.

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Definitions

A **Non-admitted patient (NAP)** or client of a health service facility is one who receives a service without undergoing a formal admission process.

A **non-admitted patient occasion of service** (NAPOOS) is a measure of the output for the part of the public health system that provides health care services to non-admitted patients. An **occasion of service** is any examination, consultation, treatment or other service provided by a health service provider to a patient on each occasion such service is provided.

The NSW HIV/AIDS and Sexual Health Ambulatory Care Minimum Data Set count two types of NAPOOS:

- 1. Individual (where a single patient or a family group receives one or more non-admitted patient services directly from any health care professional attached to a health care facility); and,
- 2. Non face-to-face (where the service provider and the client are in different locations during service provision, including services provided via telephone, telemedicine, case planning, case management and transport).

Summary

Key performance data

HIV testing

The 2018/19 HIV testing KPI is 27,914 tests by the end of the 2018-19 financial year. This figure is the same as the 2017/18 KPI and based on the target figure, not actual testing numbers.

From January to December 2018 24,871 HIV tests were performed in SESLHD (Table 1, Figure 1), an increase of 5.5% compared with 2017. However, the 12,857 tests during performed from July 2018 to December 2018 is 8% below the 2018/19 KPI target of 13,957 tests.

HIV treatment

The NSW HIV Strategy 2016-2020 aims to increase the proportion of people diagnosed with HIV on ART to 95%. In 2018 SESLHD met this target, with 96.4% of people diagnosed with HIV on ART (Table 3)

SESLHD HARP services performance

Non-admitted patient occasions of service

Overall, there was a 5.8% increase in total occasions of service (OOS) across SESLHD in 2018 compared to the total for 2017 (Table 5, Figure 3). However, for The Albion Centre and the HIV Outreach team, OOS decreased by 6.1% and 23.2% respectively. This is partly due to data entry issues related to eMR CH (CHOC). OOS also decreased by 14.5% at Kirketon Road Centre, due to staffing shortages and a change to a results management policy, designed to free up clinical time.

Number of clients attending services

There was a 1.9 % increase in the total number of clients attending SESLHD services in 2018 compared with 2017 (Table 7, Figure 4).

Client Indigenous status

Although the number of Aboriginal/Torres Strait clients attending HARP services has increased slightly overall (1.8%) in 2018, there is still room for improvement amongst some services.

Occasions of service in priority populations

In 2018 50.9% of OOS were provided to clients who reported sexual contact with the same sex, 14% to injecting drug users, 12.7% to sex workers and 4.4% to Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islanders people (Table 10).

Session type

The majority of OOS across SESLHD were delivered face-to-face (57.3%), 34.9% via phone or letter, 4.4% by case management and the reminder by case conference (0.8%), in a group (1.5%) or via an "other" session type (1.01%). In consultation with the BIEU, definitions for case management and case conference are currently being revised by the Ministry of Health.

Client country of birth

For SESLHD, the number of occasions of service by the 5 most predominant client countries of birth other than Australia for the period 2014-2018 were England, China, Thailand, New Zealand and Ireland (Table 13, Figure 9). The 2018 report shows this is the first year that China has exceeded Thailand for number of OOS. Overall, during this period, OOS have increased for clients born in China and Thailand (72.3% and 36.9% respectively), whilst decreasing in clients born in New Zealand (18.9%), England (16.4%) and Ireland (13.8%).

Client residence location

Over half (56.1%) of OOS were in clients who are residents of SESLHD, with almost 40% in clients from outside the district. The proportion of OOS provided to clients from within and outside of SESLHD by service are consistent with those in 2017. Due to location and target populations, the Albion Centre and Sydney Sexual Health Centre continue to have the highest percentages (50% and 45% respectively) of non-SESLHD residents.



Reports the number of patients accessing HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) in SESLHD HARP services

HIV PrEP background

Widespread roll-out of PrEP in SESLHD services and s100 general practices occurred from 2016-2018 as part of the EPIC-NSW study, which aimed to assess the impact of the rapid expansion in access to PrEP amongst those at high risk of acquiring HIV.

Initial recruitment targets of 3,700 were soon reached following commencement of the study in March 2016, and grew to over 9,700 by April 2018, when enrolments ceased following the listing of PrEP on the Australian Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS). The timeline of EPIC-NSW is shown in Figure 2 (page 11).

EPIC-NSW recruits were transitioned from the study according to their date of enrolment, with final participants due to be phased off by March 2019. Those wishing to continue taking PrEP are required to obtain a script to purchase PrEP: a) via the PBS at a subsidised price with a Medicare card; b) at full price in Australia if not Medicare eligible; or, c) online from overseas by self-importation.

The number of clients accessing PrEP at SESLHD services for 2018 is shown below in Table 4.



Activity by service unit

The number of occasions of service by service unit for the period from 2016-2018 for SESLHD and ISLHD is reported in Table 6.

A non-admitted patient service unit is a team with a common clinical purpose administered/managed by a single parent health organisation. It may: provide services at different geographical locations; consist of one or more health care providers; include health care professionals based at multiple health care sites; and/or be composed of providers paid from multiple cost centres. Each service unit has a classification with a price weight attached to each service event.













Figure 10 SES/ISLHD occasions of service by residence location (Period: 2018)





Figure 11 shows the areas district residents access services



Occasions of service by service unit (2016-2018)




Number of occasions of service (2014-2018)





Figure 2 Number of clients (2014-2018)

Occasions of service by service unit (2016-2018)




Occasions of service by residence location (2018)





Occasions of service by service unit (2016-2018)




Occasions of service by residence location (2018)





Occasions of service by service unit (2016-2018)




Occasions of service by residence location (2018)





Figure 3 Occasions of service by principal service provided (2016-2018)




Occasions of service by residence location (2018)





Occasions of service by residence location (2016-2018)





Occasions of service by service unit (2016-2018)




Occasions of service by residence location (2018)



Occasions of service by service unit (2016-2018)




Occasions of service by residence location (2018)





