HIV/AIDS and Related Programs (HARP) Unit – South Eastern Sydney Local Health District (SESLHD)

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Background

South Eastern Sydney Local Health District (SESLHD) has a wide range of population health programs and services largely located within the Directorate of Population and Community Health (PaCH). The HIV and Related Programs (HARP) Unit sits within this directorate

A key strategy for HARP has been the *NSW HIV Strategy* released in December 2015. The Strategy's goals and targets work towards the virtual elimination of HIV transmission by 2020. In 2019 SESLHD released the [HIV and Sexual Health Strategy 2019-2024](#) which provides an overarching framework for HIV and sexual health service provision and development in SESLHD over the next five years.

As the South Eastern Sydney Local Health District, (SESLHD) NSW has approximately 40% of the population living with or seeking treatment for HIV within its borders, SESLHD's response to the challenge requires a coordinated approach and support from the Chief Executive (CE), the Directorate, the HIV and Sexual Health Service Directors, and our community partners. The HARP Unit has a long standing history and works in partnership with both the Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District (ISLHD) and the IBAC Unit, St Vincent's Hospital (Darlinghurst), and both provide data for inclusion in the report.

The HARP Unit Informatics team manages performance and activity data for The Albion Centre, Prince of Wales Hospital HIV Infectious Diseases Unit, Sydney Sexual Health Centre, the Kirketon Road Centre, HIV Outreach Team, St George Waratah Clinic and St George Short St Clinic. Since July 2019, services' on CHOC have had their data extracts fed directly to the EDWARD data warehouse. However, the responsibility for monthly data collection and data management remains with the HARP Unit for the purpose of data quality control (eMR error checks), performance reporting, and management of Activity Based Funding (ABF).

The HARP data report is produced bi-annually.

Objective

This report presents: (1) SESLHD HARP services progression in meeting the aims of the NSW HIV Strategy and performance measures set by NSW Health; (2) eMR CH WebNAP activity data reported to the SESLHD Business Intelligence Unit (BIEU) and relayed on to NSW Health. Additionally, data used locally to provide analysis of SESLHD HARP services performance tabled at the HIV and Sexual Health Steering Committee meeting; and, (3) Occasions of Service and number of clients by service.

Scope

Section 1 of the report covers SESLHD HARP services. Section 2 covers seven services from SESLHD; one service from ISLHD and one service from St Vincent's Health Network. Section 3 covers individual reports on all nine services.

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Definitions

An **occasion of service (OOS)** is any examination, consultation, treatment or other service provided by a health service provider to a patient on each occasion such service is provided.

The NSW HIV and Sexual Health Minimum Data Set count two types of OOS:

1. Individual (where a single patient or a family group receives one or more non-admitted patient services directly from any health care professional attached to a health care facility); and,
2. Non face-to-face (where the service provider and the client are in different locations during service provision, including services provided via telephone, telemedicine, case planning, case management and transport).

Summary

Key performance data

HIV testing

The 2019-2020 Local Health District target is to maintain or increase the number of HIV tests compared to the target in 2018-2019 - 27,914 tests/FY

In 2019 HIV testing remained stable, both overall and within individual services, compared with 2018, with 24,815 HIV tests were performed in SESLHD (Table 1, Figure 1),

However, the 12,803 tests during performed from July 2019 to December 2019 is 8% below the 2019/20 FY target of 6979 tests per quarter.

HIV treatment

The NSW HIV Strategy 2016-2020 aims to increase the proportion of people diagnosed with HIV on ART to 95%. In 2019 SESLHD met this target, with 96% of people diagnosed with HIV on ART (Table 3)

SESLHD HARP services performance

Non-admitted patient occasions of service

There was an 11% increase in total OOS in 2019 compared with 2018. (Table 4, Figure 2).

Number of clients attending services

There was a 4% increase in the total number of clients attending SESLHD services in 2019 compared with 2018 (Table 6, Figure 3).

Client Indigenous status

The number of Aboriginal/Torres Strait clients attending SESLHD HARP services has increased by 6% in 2019. (Table 8, Figure 5).

Occasions of service in priority populations

In 2019 54% of OOS were provided to clients who reported sexual contact with the same sex, 16% to injecting drug users, 14% to sex workers and 4% to Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islanders people (Table 9).

Session type

Over half of all OOS across SESLHD in 2019 were delivered face-to-face (57%), around a third (36%) via phone or letter, 4% by case management and the remainder by case conference (1%), in a group (0.7%) or via an "other" session type (0.4%) (Table 10).

Client age

Across SESLHD as a whole, the majority of OOS were for clients aged 25-29 and 30-34 years (42%), whilst age profiles differed between individual services, as illustrated in Figures 7-8.

Client country of birth

In SESLHD HARP services in 2019, the number of OOS by the five most predominant client countries of birth other than Australia were: England, Thailand, China, New Zealand and Ireland (Table 12,

Figure 9). In 2019, numbers of OOS in clients born in China overtook OOS in those born in England for the first time since 2015. Compared to 2018, OOS have increased for clients born in China (26%), Thailand (6%) and Ireland (13%), whilst remaining stable in those born in New Zealand, and decreasing in clients born in England (-4%).

Client residence location

Consistent with 2018, over half (57%) of OOS were in clients who are residents of SESLHD, with almost 40% in clients from outside the district. Albion Centre and Sydney Sexual Health Centre continue to have the highest percentages (49% and 45% respectively) of non-SESLHD residents (Table 13, Figure 10).

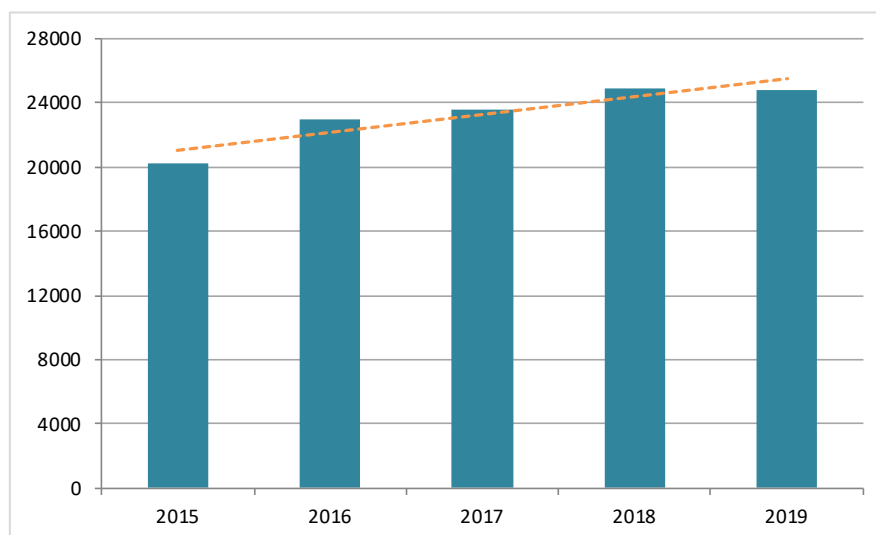

HIV testing by priority population

The number of HIV tests by priority population by service for 2019 is shown in Table 2.

The vast majority of tests (69%) were performed in MSM, 15% in sex workers, 5% in PWID and 1% in Aboriginal/Torres Strait clients.

In 2019 SESLHD met the target 95%, with 96% of people diagnosed with HIV on ART

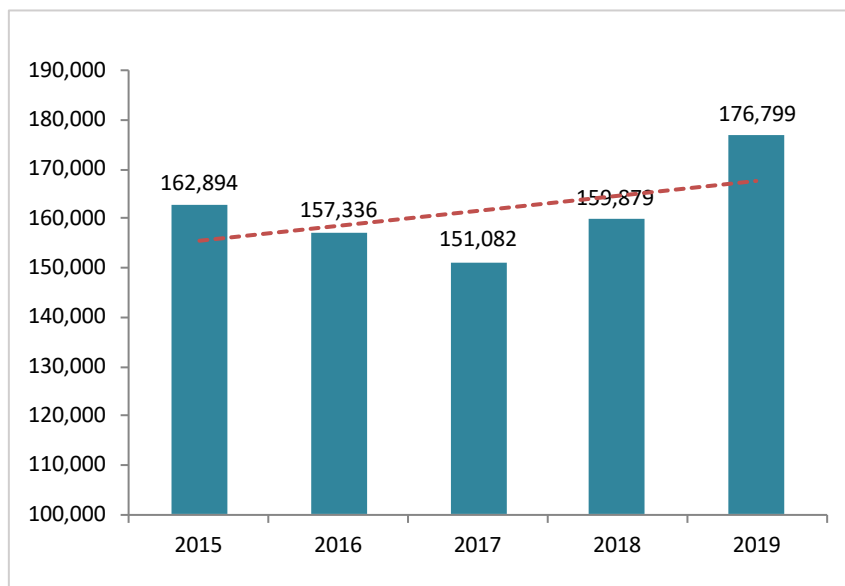

Activity by service unit

The number of occasions of service by service unit for 2019 for SESLHD and ISLHD is reported in Table 5.

A non-admitted patient service unit is a team with a common clinical purpose managed by a single parent health organisation. It may: provide services at different geographical locations; consist of one or more health care providers; include health care professionals based at multiple health care sites; and/or be composed of providers paid from multiple cost centres. Each service unit has a classification with a price weight attached to each service event.

There was a 4% increase in the total number of clients attending SESLHD services in 2019 compared with 2018.

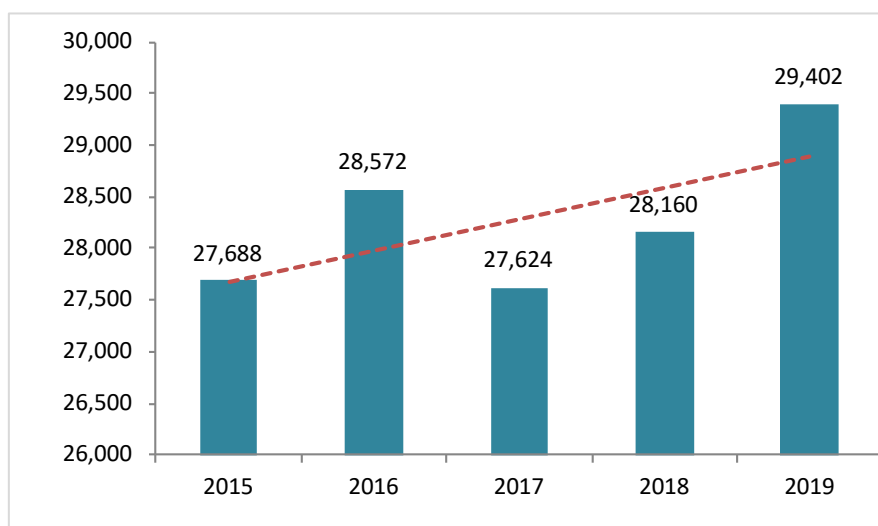

Overall, three-quarters of clients presenting at SESLHD HARP services in 2019 were male.

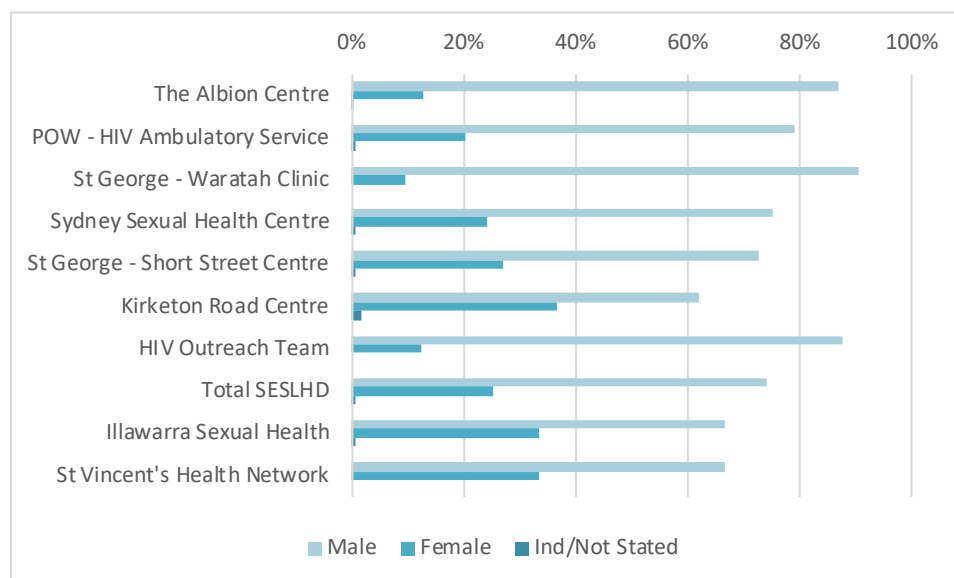

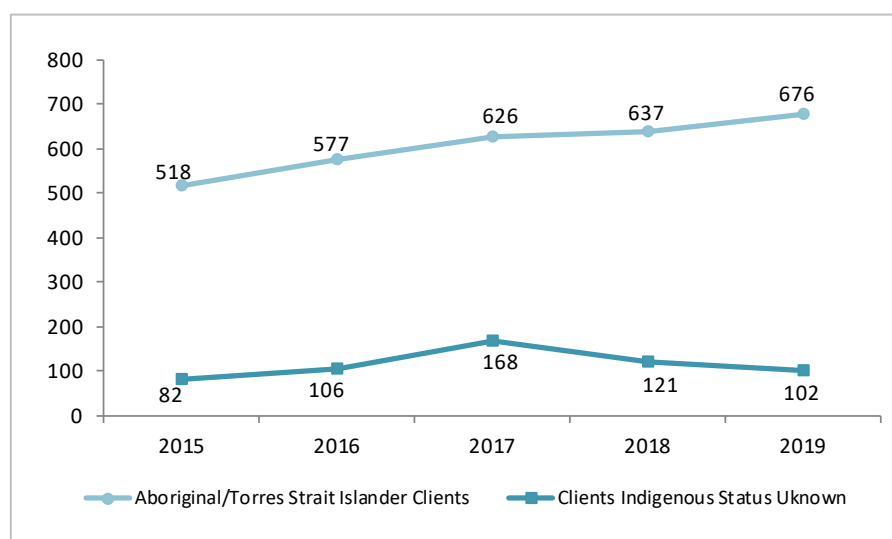

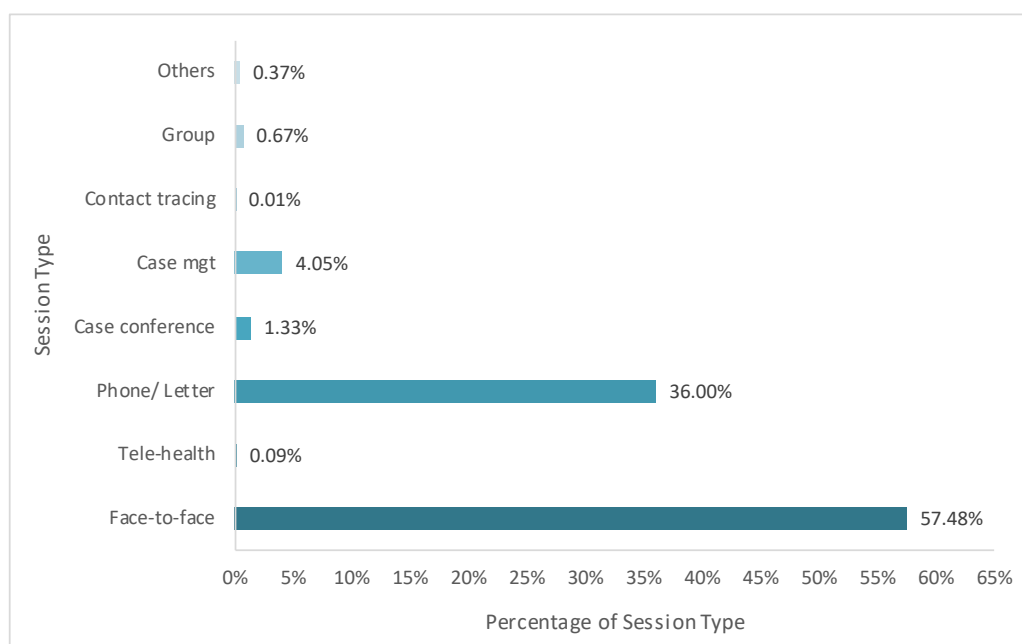

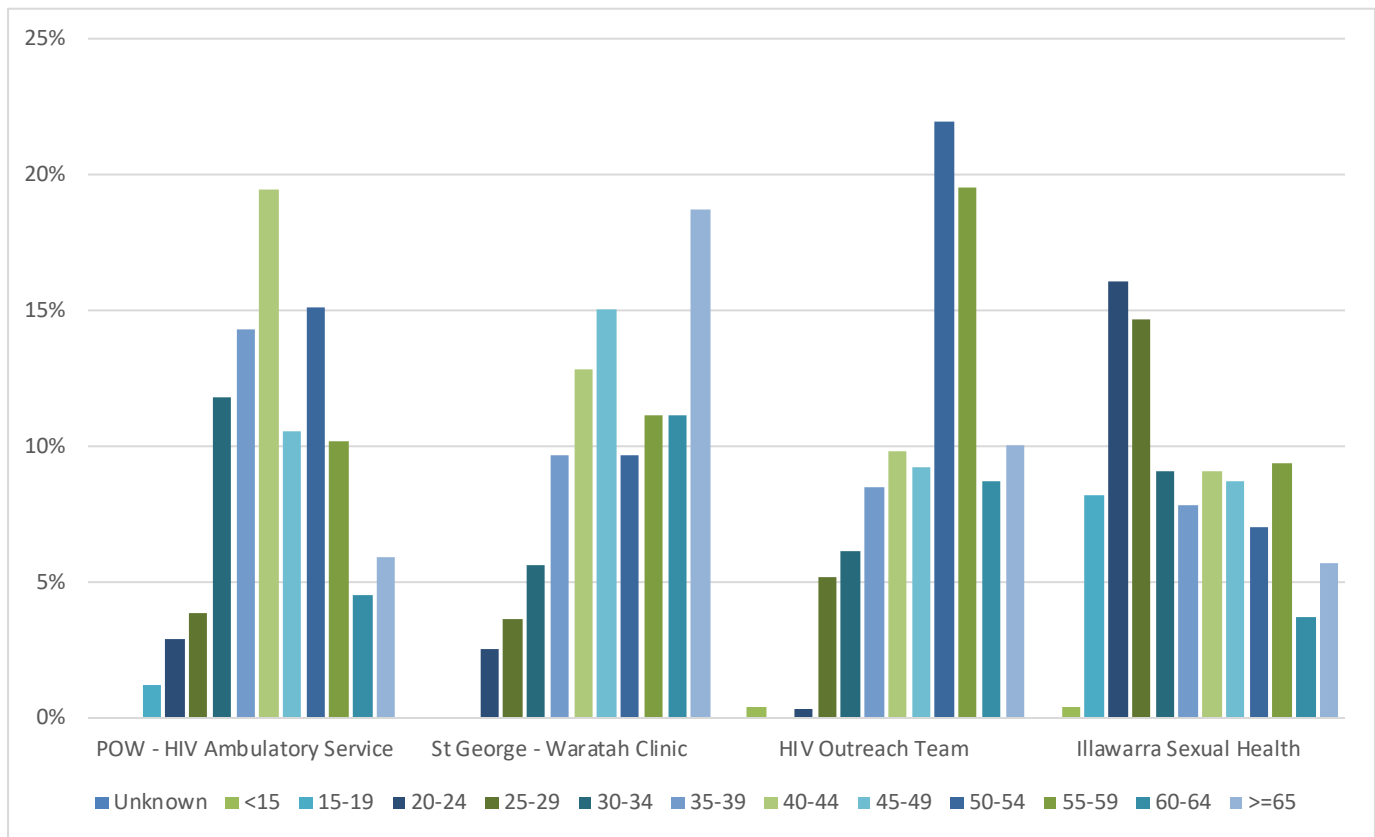
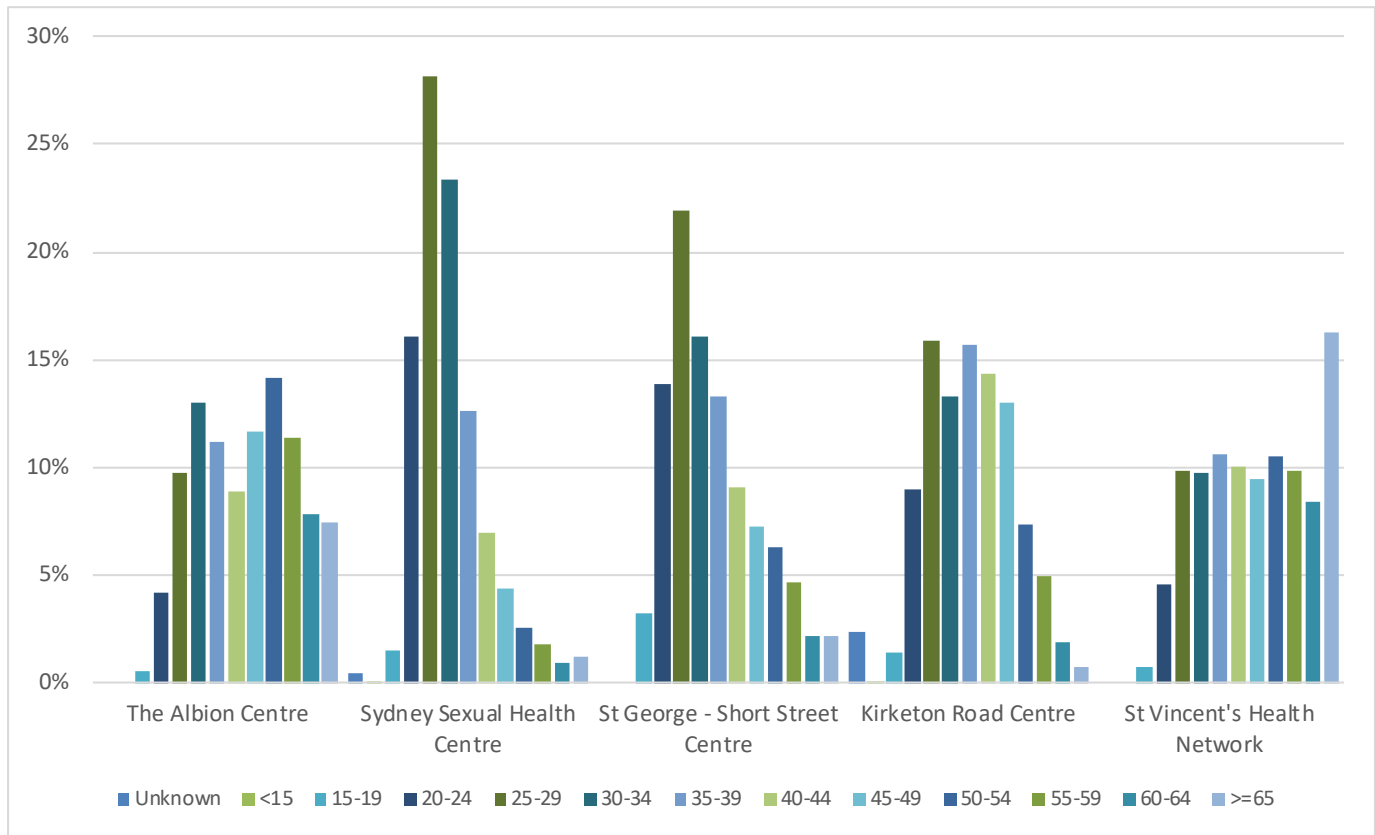

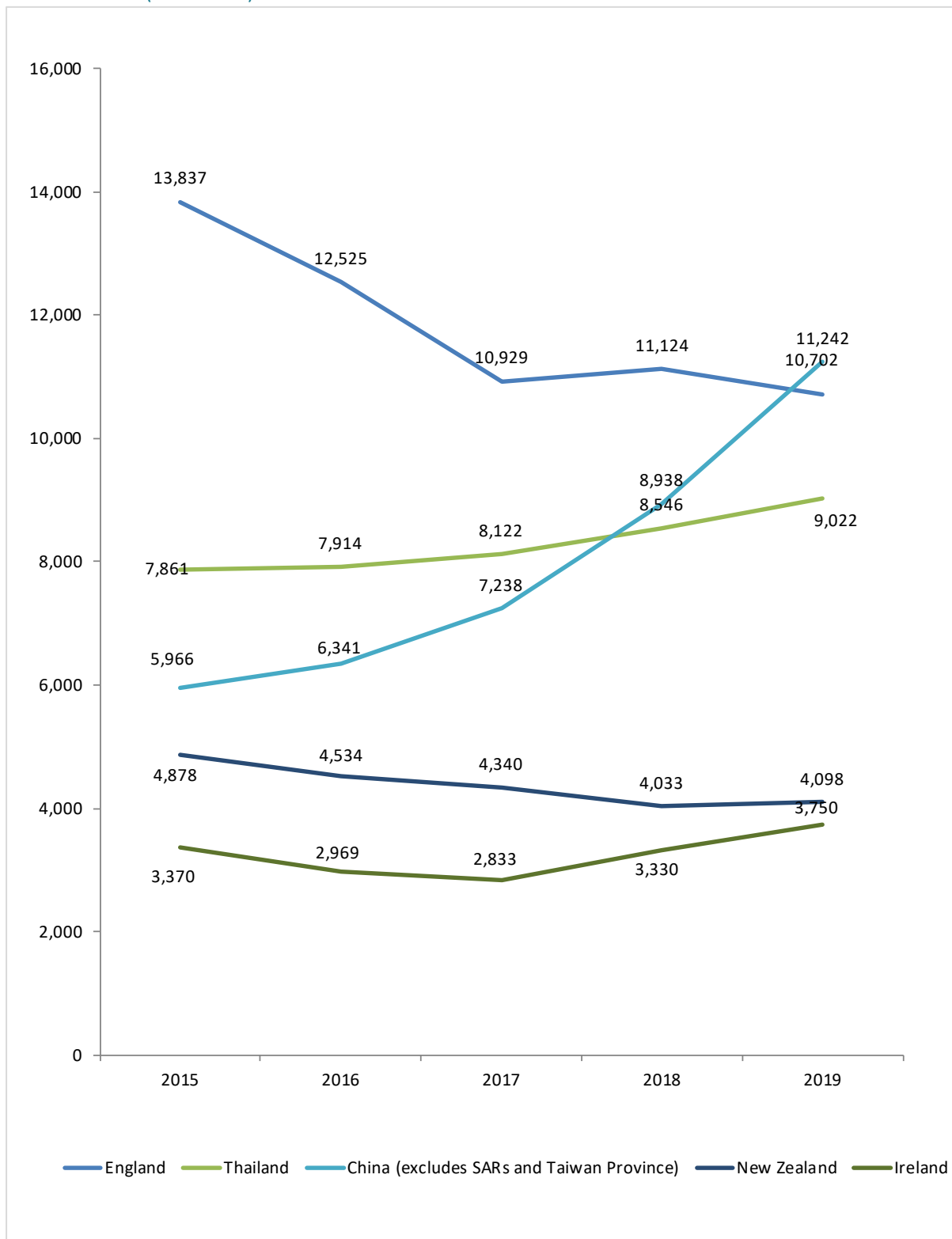

SES/ISLHD occasions of service by residence location (2019)

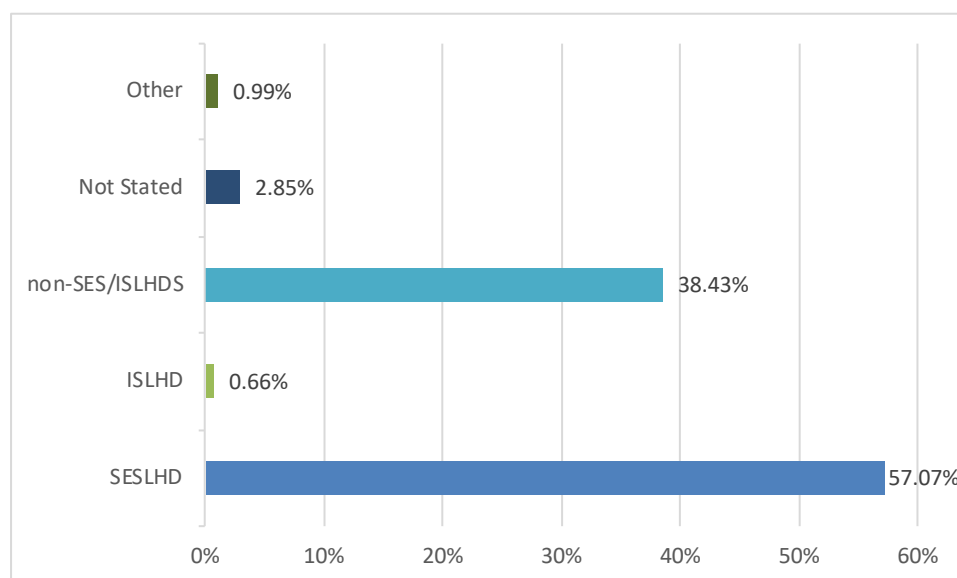
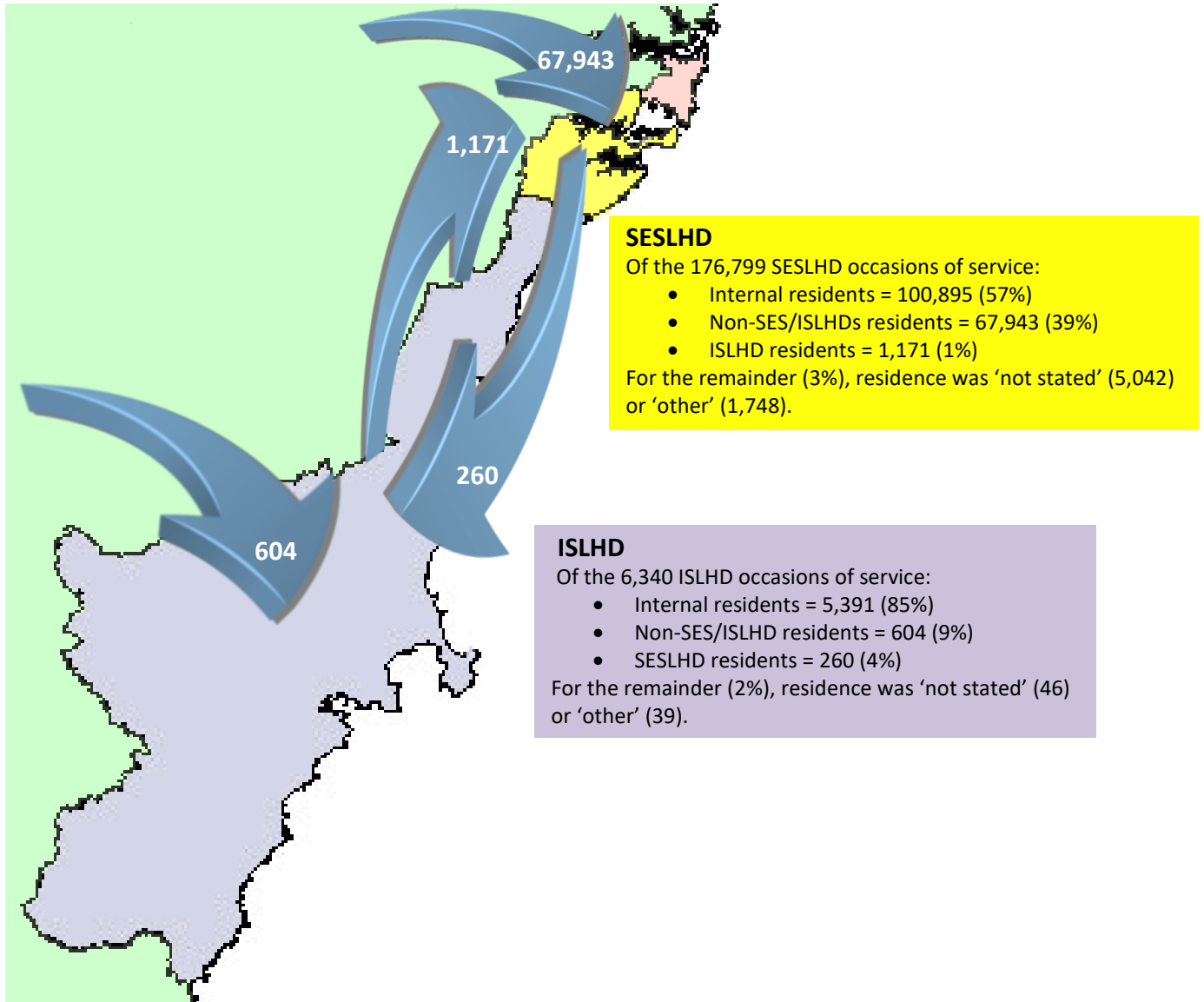

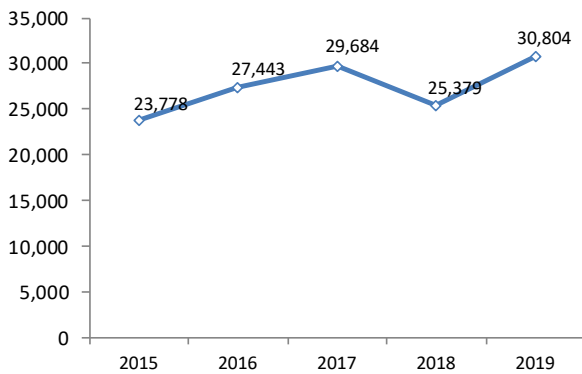
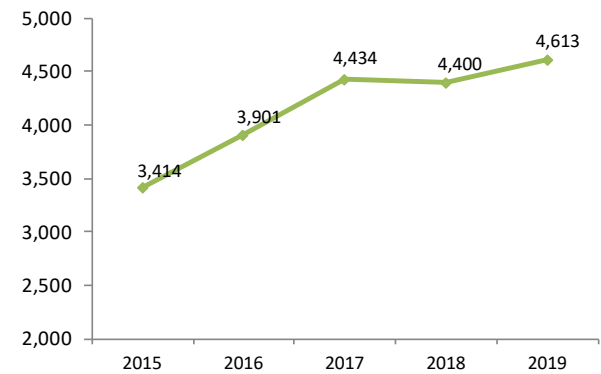

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

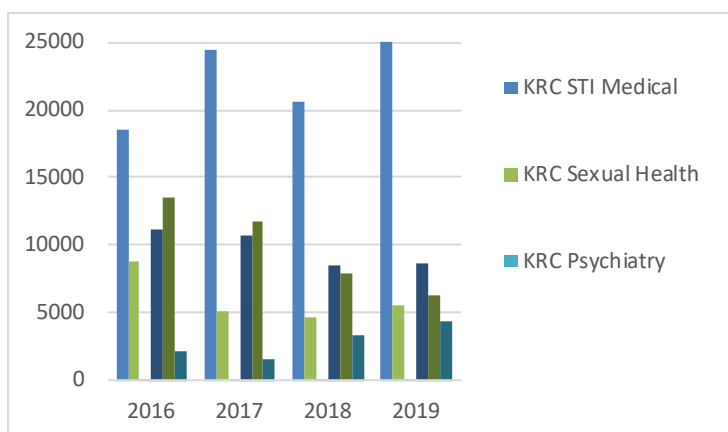
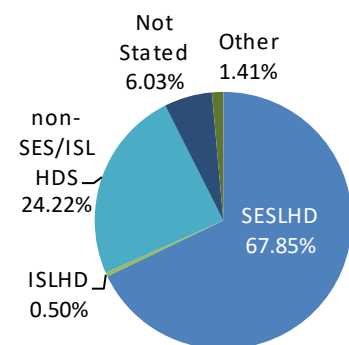

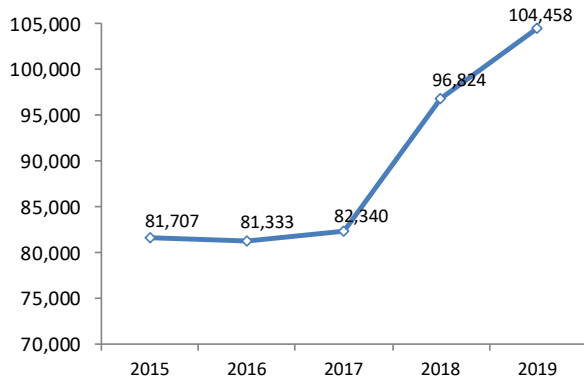
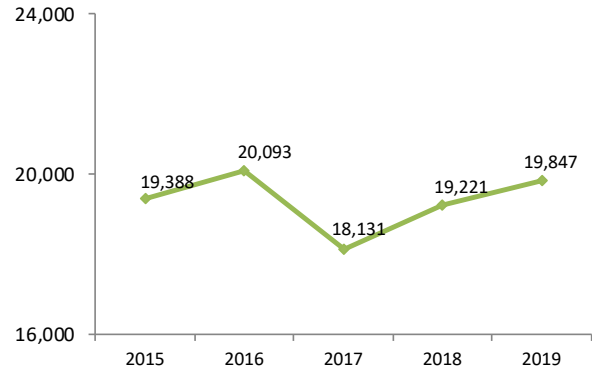

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

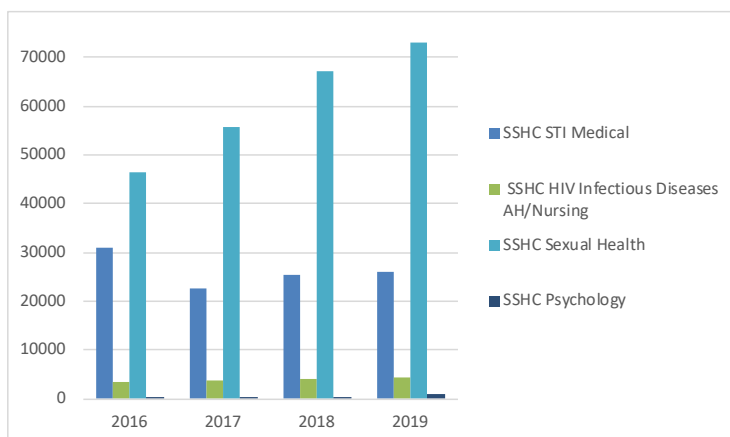
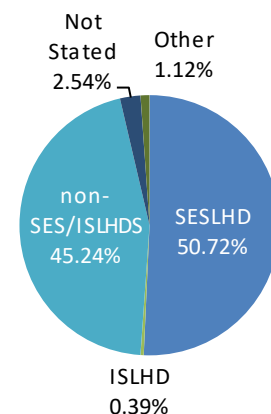

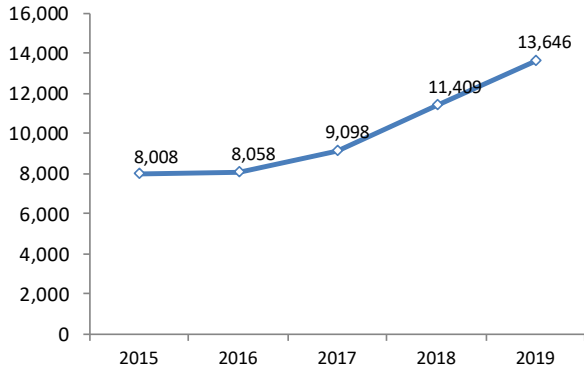
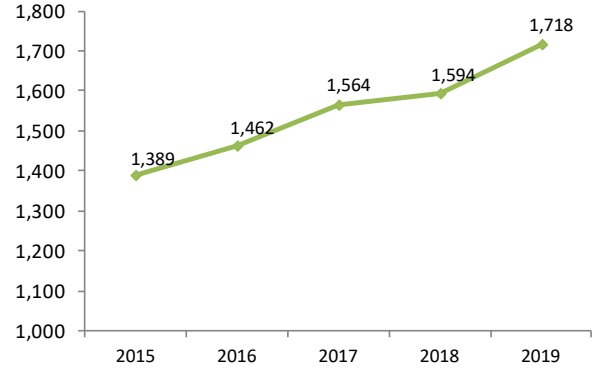

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

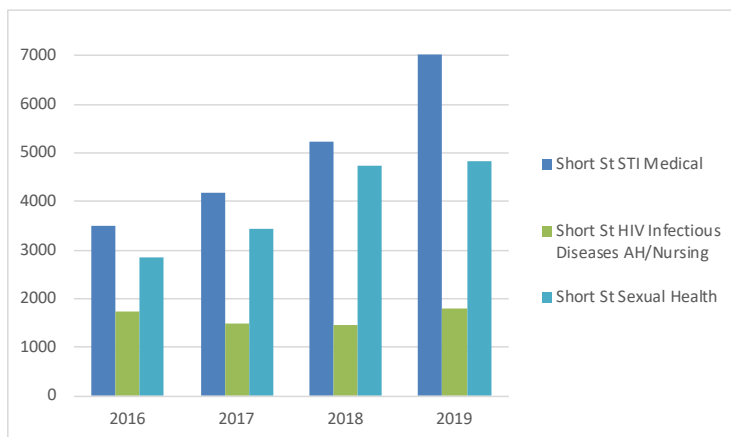
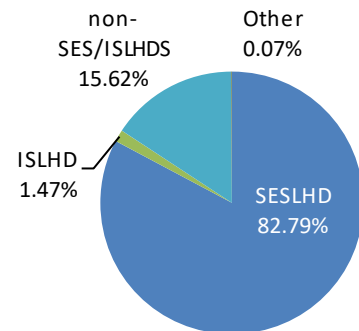

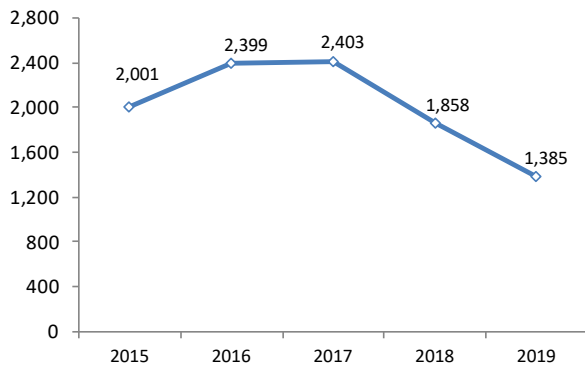
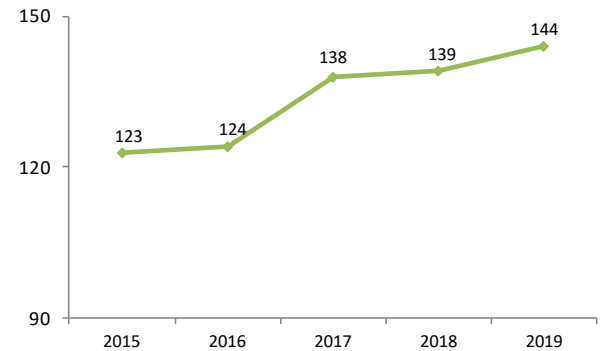

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

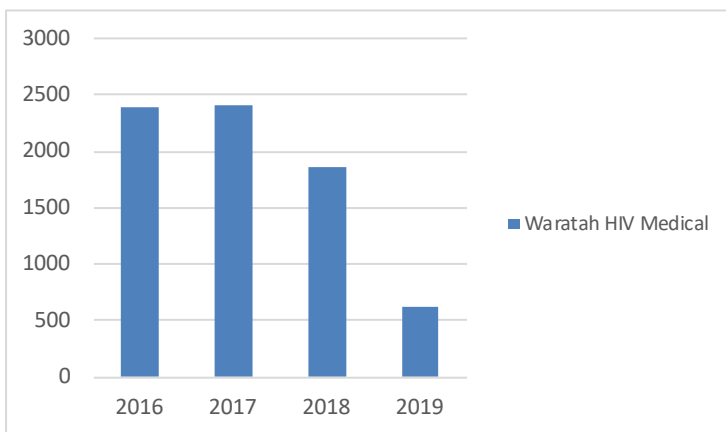
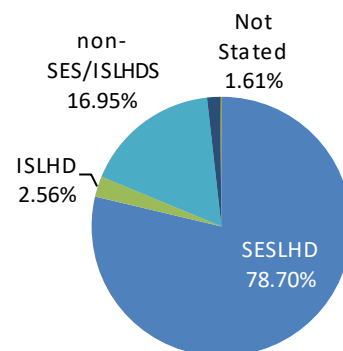

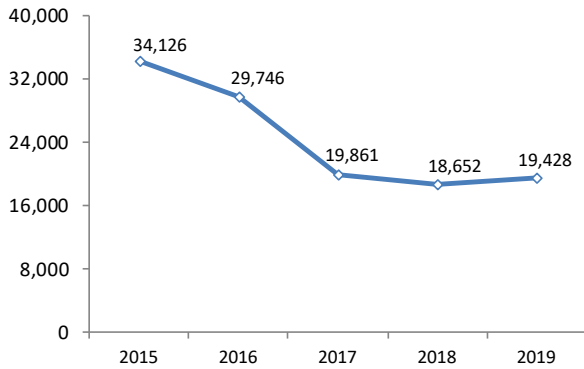
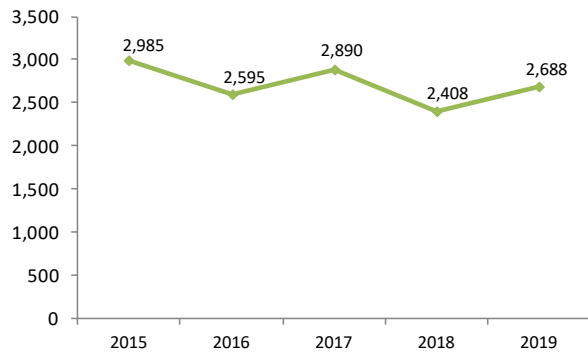

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

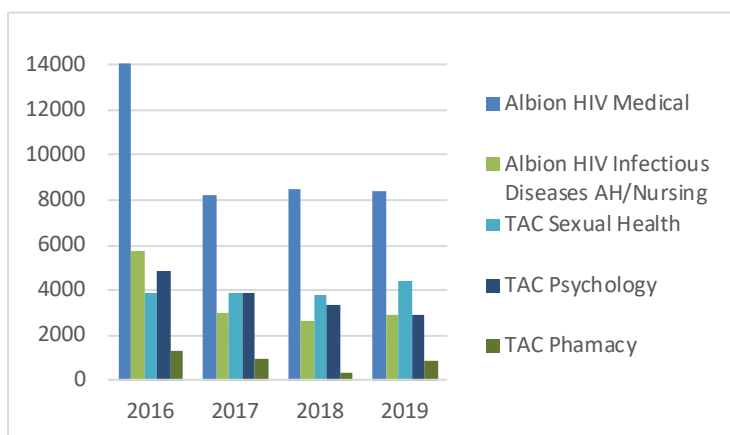
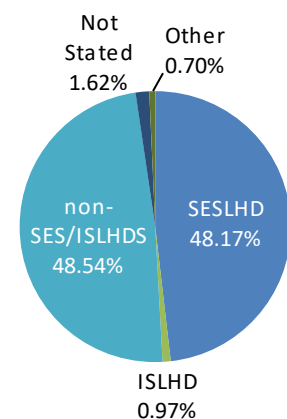

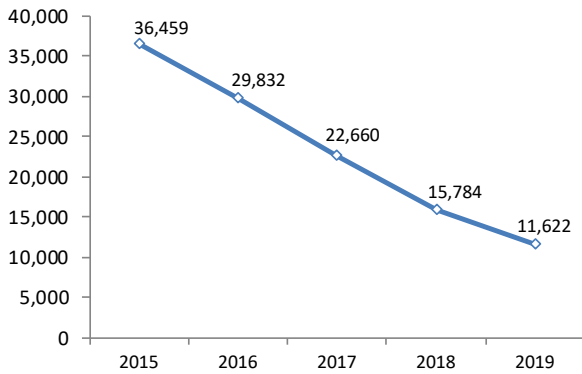
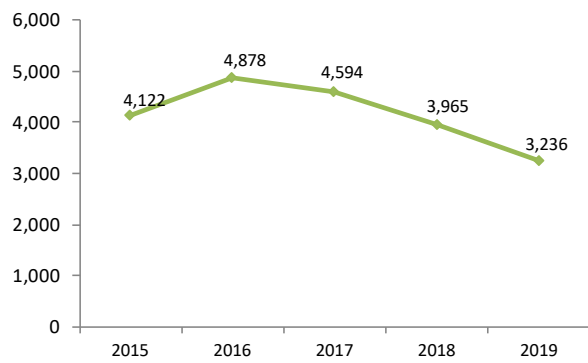

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

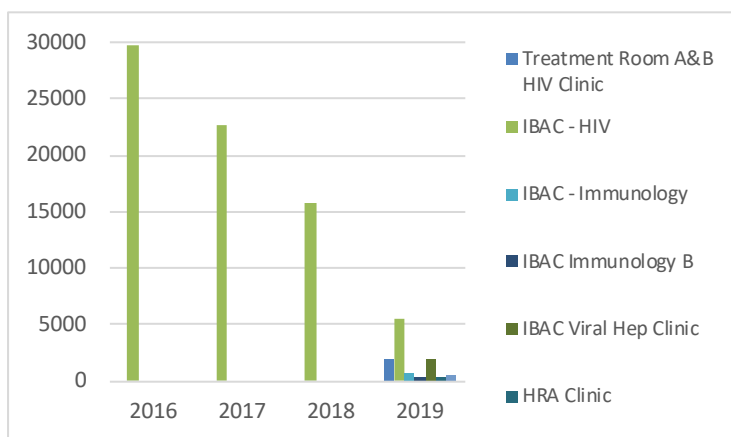
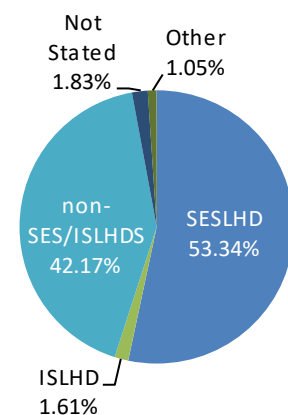

Number of occasions of service (2015-2019)

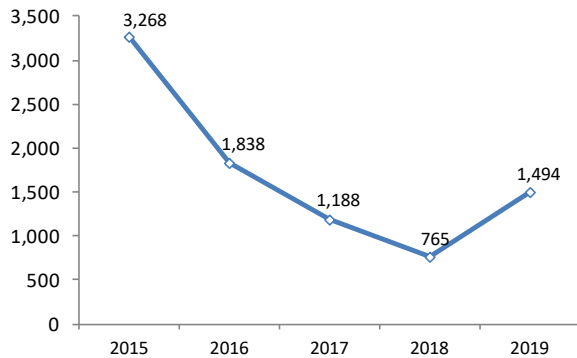
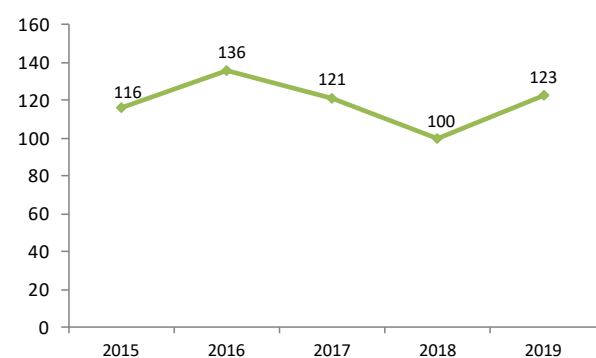

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

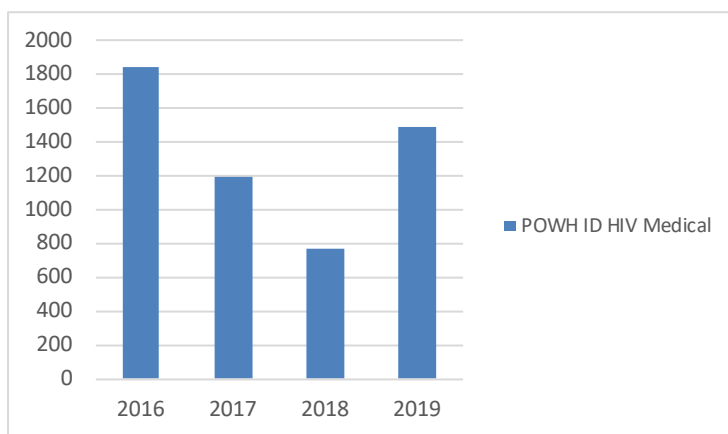
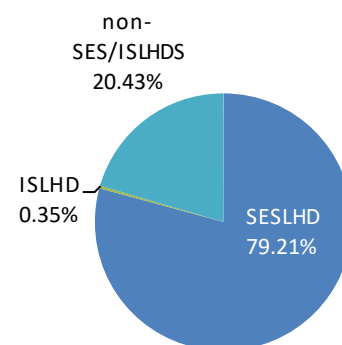

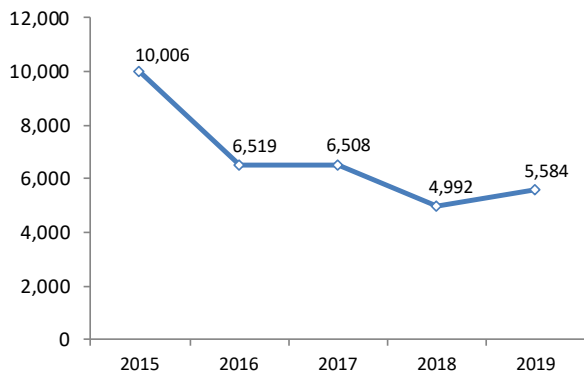
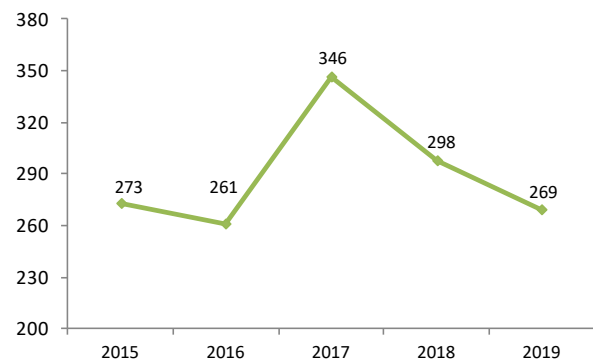

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

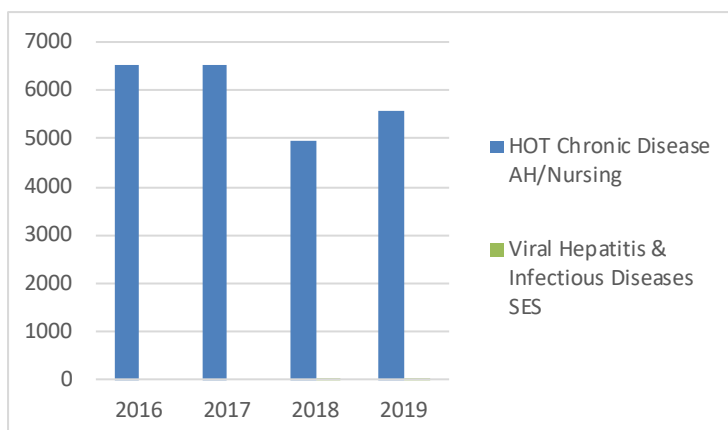
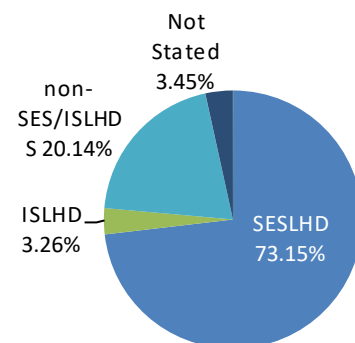

Number of occasions of service (2015-2019)

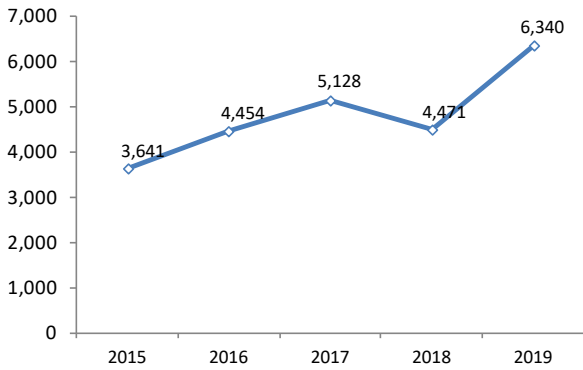
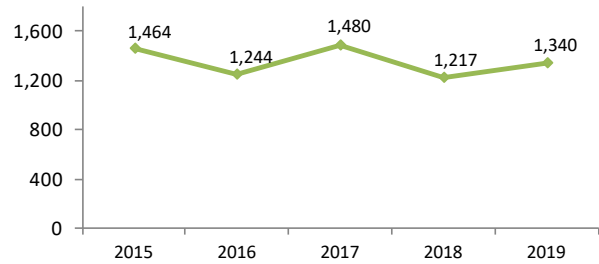

Occasions of service, by service unit (2016-2019)

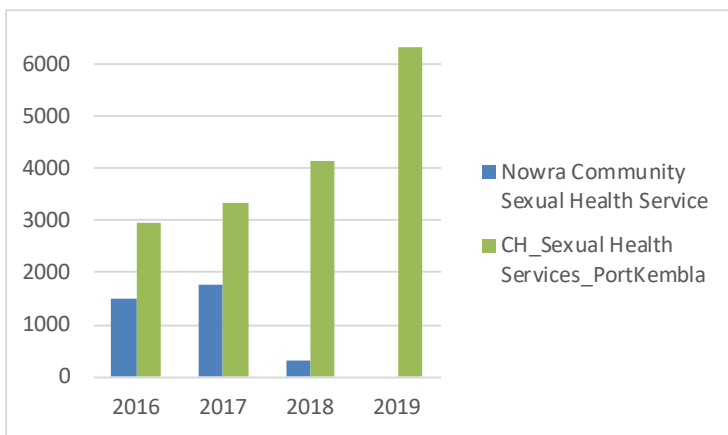
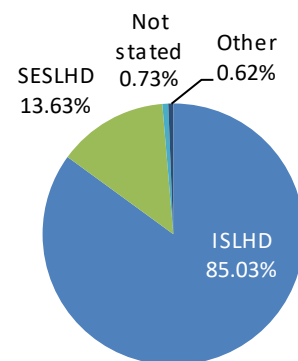
