



ESMHS Aspiring Educator Program

The Mental Health Aspiring Educator Development Program is a 12-week program that aims to develop the capacity of nursing staff to become a leader in education within their practice setting and to be able step in the Clinical Nurse Educator role.

The program involves:

- Two study days shadowing one of the CNEs
- 12 weeks of mentorship
- Learning and demonstrating practice development skills
- The development of a teaching session
- The participant being a facilitator of one of the key priority mental health training sessions.

By the end of the program participants will:

- Have the skills to lead practice development of staff within their settings
- Lead practice change and create positive changes to workplace culture
- Be identified as a leader in education
- Have the skills to be an exemplary support for junior and new staff
- Be a part of the shared vision for education within the ESMHS
