## Registered Nurse GradStart – 2021 Perioperative Stream

The Prince of Wales Hospital is a major teaching hospital based in Sydney's eastern suburbs that serves all of New South Wales. The hospital is situated close to the city, Bondi Beach, excellent shopping facilities, and within walking distance to Coogee Beach.

We are affiliated with the University of NSW, one of the premier medical teaching facilities in Australia. This assists us to provide excellence in care in conjunction with our commitment to clinical teaching and medical research.

Currently the NSW Government is investing \$720 million to redevelop the Prince of Wales Hospital and progress the vision of Randwick as a world-leading centre for health and wellbeing, research, education and teaching. An Acute Services Building will be built in Stage 1 including a new adult emergency department, extra beds, intensive care unit, and new operating theatres for the campus.

More than just a new hospital building, this major redevelopment will transform how we deliver health services at Randwick. This facility will enable us to continue to attract and retain the best nurses, doctors and support staff and meet the changing health needs of our community. The redevelopment expands opportunities for cutting-edge health research, world first treatments and improved patient outcomes.

We offer Registered Nurses transition through a General Stream which encompasses a diverse range of clinical specialties. We also offer a separate Perioperative Stream.

The GradStart Perioperative Stream encompasses a diverse range of clinical specialties within the Randwick Campus Operating Suite and the Murnaghan Urology Centre. The Randwick Campus Operating Suite, based at Prince of Wales Hospital, consists of 21 operating rooms including a hybrid theatre. We are unique in that we provide care to patients of Prince of Wales Hospital, Sydney Children's Hospital and the Royal Hospital for Women. We are able to provide you with excellent educational opportunities across a broad range of all adult and paediatric specialties (excluding cardiothoracic surgery which is a separate theatre) and including rotations to the separate Urology Suite.

If you are searching for a supportive learning environment where your previous experiences and opinions are valued and respected, then register us as your first preference to ensure that your career is off to a flying start. Our nurses are committed to providing excellent person centered care through a practice development approach. ## Transition Framework

Our nursing staff are empowered by shared decision making and are encouraged and supported in leadership development from the beginning of their journey at Prince of Wales.

Your learning and development is important to us and we provide opportunities during working hours to engage in reflective practices for professional learning

Ongoing support is provided by a wide range of clinicians and experts in their field: Transition Facilitator, Nurse Educator, Clinical Nurse Educators, Clinical Nurse Consultant, Nurse Practitioners, Clinical Nurse Specialists, and Advanced Practice Nurses.

Each individual Registered Nurse will be assigned a Preceptor who will be identified prior to commencement of the first supernumerary shift.

POWH has a strong research focus and our nurses have won awards, published and presented on the international stage, so whatever direction you take in Nursing, there is something here to progress your career that has been considered by our expert professional team.
