GradStart positions are offered in both Gynaecology/Gynaecological Oncology (Macquarie Unit) and Adult Acute Care.

Transition Framework

The Transition Framework in **Gynaecology and Gynaecological Oncology** (known as **Macquarie Ward**) offers a comprehensive introduction to medical and surgical nursing in the context of women's health. As such, it also addresses other factors that impact upon a women's health (e.g: social, economic) as well as non-reproductive indicators of health.

Transitioning nurses receive a thorough orientation to the hospital as well as to the areas of Gynaecology and Gynaecological Oncology (Macquarie Ward) and will be well supported throughout the 12 months by the Nursing Unit Managers, Clinical Nurse Specialists, Clinical Nurse Educator, and Clinical Nurse Consultant (Oncology).

The Adult Acute Care Centre

Within the Acute Care Centre the team cares for a wide range of women requiring high level and complex care. A Transitioning Registered Nurse will receive a 12 month comprehensive orientation and introduction into high acuity medical surgical nursing, along with an introduction to the care of antepartum and postpartum women. The Acute Care Centre provides close haemodynamic monitoring, non-invasive ventilation, and specialized high acuity nursing care within the context of women's health.

Women admitted to Acute Care Centre come in under:

- Gynaecology Oncology
- Gynaecology
- Breast/Plastic Reconstructive
- Obstetric women: antenatally and postnatally with their (well) newborn babies
- Women from any of the above specialties with complex psychological/mental health concerns
- Reproductive medicine complications

Individualised professional development plans are prepared during the orientation phase and you will be supported by a CNC who arranges Unit orientation attendance at relevant programs and in-service education. Transitioning nurses within the Acute Care Unit are supported by the Nursing Unit Manager, Clinical Nurse Consultant and Clinical Nurse Specialists, (Acute Care),

The transitional support program consists of a comprehensive orientation to both the hospital and the unit. Regular performance appraisals in collaboration with the CNC, CNE and NUM assist and support graduates to monitor their progress towards the achievement of their personal goals and also help ensure that they are developing professionally. Ongoing education is facilitated through clinical supervision and reflection, in-services and tutorials, workshops and individually negotiated learning packages in both Areas.

A full-time rotating roster is worked throughout.
