Acute pulmonary oedema Respiratory failure (will accept COPD as alternative)

List 4 contra-indications to NIV (2 marks – 0.5 each)

Coma
Combative patient
Inability to tolerate tight-fitting mask
Lack of trained staff to institute and monitor NIV

What is the mechanism of action of NIV? (3 marks)

Controlled FiO2 at set positive pressure – Recruits alveoli that were closed improving VQ match Increases pulmonary compliance, decreasing work of breathing
