Capacity

Informed - patient must have received sufficient information to make decision

Specific - minimum information requirement

Allowed sufficient time to absorb and consider information given

Freely given - not coerced

c. What is the minimum information that a patient should receive when consent for treatment is being sought? (2 Marks)

1/2 Mark each for:

Explanation of patient condition, diagnosis, or likely diagnosis

Treatment options available

Consequences, risks, side effects of proposed treatments

Consequences of not receiving treatment

d. What measures could be used to improve the consent process within the Emergency Department ? (3 Marks)

1 Mark each, to maximum of 3 marks for any of:

Review complaints / Root cause analysis

Education program

Standardise consent forms for common procedures

Audit compliance with process changes

Use of interpreters
