## SAQ 10

A 4 year old boy presents to the ED with cough, stridor and fever

- 1. List four causes of stridor in this patient (4 marks)
  - Croup Epiglottitis Bacterial tracheitis Retropharyngeal abscess Angiooedema/anaphylaxis (with concurrent febrile illness) Inhaled FB (with concurrent febrile illness)
- 2. List four features on history or examination that would make epiglottitis a more likely diagnosis (4 marks)

Not immunised Acute onset of illness Toxic/shocked appearance Very high fever Drooling Cough minimal or absent Low pitched stridor

3. In a patient with suspect epiglottitis, what are your management priorities (2 marks)

Keep child as calm as possible, avoid unnecessary interventions Secure airway – ideally in theatre with gas induction Source control – 3<sup>rd</sup> generation cephalosporin (cover HiB + others)
