### a. Describe and interpret the clinical image (4 Marks)

Describe - 1/2 each for any two descriptors:

- Erythema to right upper face
- Mutiple crusted lesions
- Eye closed with upper lid odema
- Evidence of fluorscein staining to right eye

## Interpret - 1 Mark for each of:

- CN V distribution herpes zoster / shingles
- Potential for opthalmic involvement / visual loss

## b. List 4 potential complications of this condition (4 Marks)

#### 1 Mark for each of:

- Post herpetic neuralgia
- Visual loss

#### 1 Mark each for any 2 of:

- Acute pain
- Disseminated herpes zoster
- Eye complications
  - Corneal scarring, ptosis, ectropion, entropion, glaucoma, episcleritis, keratitis, retinitis
- Super added infection

# c. Outline your management (3 Marks)

#### 1 Mark for each of:

- Antiviral (As eTG Famciclovir 250mg tds or Valaciclovir 1po tds or aciclovir 800mg x5 daily)
- Analgesia +/- adjunctive prednisolone or amitriptyline
- Opthalmology consult / review
