SAQ 2

An 18 year old man presents with increasing left hand pain 36 hours after an injury. He is unable to recall the details of how the injury occurred. A clinical image of the patient's left hand is shown on the next page.

a. Describe and interpret the clinical image (5 Marks)

Describe - 2 mark each up to marks

- Wound overlying 3rd MCPJ
- Swelling to dorsum of hand
- Normal cascade of fingers
- Wound appears necrotic
- ? Purulent discharge
- Erythema to dorsum of hand

Interpretation - 1 mark each for 3 marks

- Cellulitis of dorsum of hand
- Potential tendon / joint involvement
- Likely 'fight bite' injury

b. Outline your management (5 Marks)

Nil resus issues suggested in stem answer should focus on specific therapy

1 mark each for:

- *i.v antibiotics*
 - eTG regimes: tazocin 4.5g or timentin 3.1g or metronidazole 400mg plus ceftriaxone 1g / cefotaxime 1g or moxifloxacin 400mg po or metronidazole 400mg plus doxcycline 200mg
- Tetanus prophylaxis if required
- Disposition plastic surgeons +/- OT

1 mark each up to 2 marks from:

- Elevation
- Keep NBM / Prep for OT
- Analgesia
- Seek & treat other injuries
