## SAQ8

A 60 yr old female presents to your Emergency Department with a one-day history of fever and right arm discomfort. She is currently undergoing chemotherapy. Her vital signs are:

HR 95 bpm BP 120 / 75 Temp 38.5 °C

## a. Describe the clinical image (4 Marks)

- Absent right breast / Mastectomy
- Erythematous streak right arm distal cubital fossa to axilla
- Discolouration of right chest wall & neck / Radiotherapy changes
- Pustules in axilla / lateral scar
- Nil iv cannula in-situ / Nil port noted on right chest wall
- Nil monitoring / therapy in-situ
- Appears alert

## b. List the differentials for this patient's presentation (5 Marks)

- Febrile neutropenia
- Ascending lymphangitis / right upper limb cellulitis
- Thrombophelbitis
- Chest wall cellulitis
- Upper limb DVT
- Line infection although non-visualised in image
- Fever from other source e.g. UTI / pneumonia / Intra-abdominal
