



<ul> <li>Is the Emergency Department the safest place for this</li> </ul>		
procedure?		
<ul> <li>Does the area have the appropriate resources?</li> </ul>		
(equipment/ monitoring/ staffing)		
Patient Assessment:		
<ul> <li>AMPLE History (allergies, medications, PMHx, last</li> </ul>		
ate, events)		
<ul> <li>Consider ASA status</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Difficult airway evaluation (LEMON, BONES)</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Prior problems with anaesthesia / sedation</li> </ul>		
Patient weight		
<ul> <li>Informed consent obtained</li> </ul>		
Monitoring		
Continuous Pulse Ox		
• End-tidal CO2		
• ECG		
• BP $-3-5$ min cycle		
Equipment		
Oxygen via NRBM		
• Suction		
Airway adjuncts		
Resus trolley with defibrillator		
Medication		
Appropriate choice of medication, dose calculated		
Appropriate IV access		
• 1L bag fluids on pump set

## Mallampati Score:



#### **ASA** rating

- I. Normal healthy patient
- II. Mild systemic disease
- III. Severe systemic disease limiting activity but not incapacitating
- IV. Incapacitating systemic disease that is a constant threat to life
- V. Moribund, not expected to survive with or without the operation

Add E for emergency operation

### LEMON

Difficult Laryngoscopy:

- Look externally
- Evaluate 3-3-2 rule
- Mallampati score
- Obstruction
- Neck mobility

#### **BONES**

#### Difficult BVM:

- Beard
- Obese
- No teeth
- Elderly
- Sleep apnoea / snoring
