Still some delays admitting patients: suggested this may be due to finding appropriate specialist to admit patients under – some patients presenting with multiple cross-specialty problems Patient Flow weekly reporting meeting has commenced. S Hoskins-Marr War Memorial Hospital Continuum of Care • Attended meeting on 11 May 2010-06-15 Allied Health have secured COAG funding for the flying squad • Physiotherapy is looking for a locum to help fill staff vacancy • Ward clerks are distributing inpatient admission packs. Most patients have dementia so it is difficult to explain the Rights & Responsibilities brochure to them. Will need to explain this to next of kin or carer instead.			
 Incident & Complaints Review Committee Presentation from Alistair Hodge (Clinical Nurse Consultant in ED) about the triage system. S Hoskins-Marr obtained a copy of the triage report to distribute to the other consumer reps POWP has complained there are no wheelchairs at the main entrance for POWP patients to use. POWP needs to address this problem as not responsibility of POWH. Problems encountered by people ringing POWH and either not being answered or not being transferred. CPIU is investigating this problem further – ascertaining how many calls not answered and where this is occurring.
