PRESENTATION - Dr Debra Kennedy, Mothersafe (medications in pregnancy service)

Dr Kennedy provided a background to the service which began in 2000 as predominantly a telephone service:

- Paediatric specialist in clinical genetics wanting to prevent babies with birth defects
- Identified a need to educate people in safety and prevention
- Service is customer focused
- Unlike other services Mothersafe takes calls from consumers
- Quite a number of pregnancies are not planned so there will be exposure as well as women with a chronic illness needing medication
- 1st year 2,000 calls; 2003 8,700 calls, 2006 over 15,500 calls, 2009 20,200 calls, 2012 221,786 calls and in 2013-14 23,000 approximately.
- In the beginning 60% calls were from consumers but now it is 80% predominantly women
- Health care professions, general practitioners, nurses, midwives, lactation consultants, genetic counsellors and pharmacist also seek advice
- Vast majority is by telephone
- Three staff on duty every day: two on the telephone, one does follow up to ascertain outcome, website and fact sheets
- Recently launched a facebook page
- 1% of women with more serious concerns and/or chronic conditions are referred to Dr Kennedy's clinic, eg occupational exposures, substance abuse issues, concerned about terminating a pregnancy due to exposure

- Also conduct a Pregnancy Planning, Lifestyle & Nutrition (PLAN) clinic which is midwifery run – it is held once a fortnight at RHW and once a fortnight at Sydney Hospital
- Dr Kennedy participates in teaching medical students and various medical groups, eg general practitioners
- Important to disseminate our knowledge to other professionals
- Mothersafe provides a state-wide service
- Interpreter service is used on a case by case basis and can be organised in advance if English is not the first language
- General Practitioners are also helpful Mothersafe counsellers send them the relevant fact sheets and they explain and/or translate to their patient
- Callers are not always identifiable as having a disability Dr Kennedy has seen patients with disabilities in clinic as they usually require advice on chronic medications
- A telephone service is sometimes beneficial for people with limited mobility
- Callers outside the city have access to an 1800 number which is a free call
- Looking at the data the service demographic favours motivated well educated
- It was suggested the service should look at avenues to address the issues of culture and language – send the mission statement to the ethnic press and they will translate for publication
- Currently some information in different languages is available on the website and ways to increase these are being explored
- Mothersafe flyers are available in all public hospital antenatal clinics
- Chemical Use in Pregnancy Service (CUPS) is a case management service run from Langton Clinic – add to list of future presentations

D Kennedy will circulate information on the Healthdirect which is a 24 hour service triaged by a nurse and is not specialised

D Kennedy and L Woodhart will ascertain if this is included in the HETI modules. T Fletcher offered her assistance in providing information or a training session. H Gunn will follow up outside the meeting.
