Workshops for people living with HIV

The Albion Centre aims to promote the health and wellbeing of people affected by HIV.

This includes supporting mental health and having a holistic approach to HIV treatment.

HIV remains a stigmatised disease and mental health issues amongst HIV positive Australians are a major problem.

Both this District and the Ministry of Health are committed to lowering rates; improving testing for the community including outreach testing and improving the care provided.

The rates of depression and anxiety are significantly higher in HIV populations as are the rates of smoking and drug and alcohol use.

Economic hardship and social isolation are substantial issues as People Living with HIV may have less support due to rejection from family because of sexuality, drug use and HIV status.

A recent Australian study showed that among Australian gay men aged 40 years or older, People Living with HIV were more likely to be receiving treatment for mental health conditions than HIV negative men.

Those living with HIV were also experiencing more psychological distress than HIV negative men (Lyon, Pitts & Grierson, 2012).

Given the increased risk of experiencing symptoms of psychological disorders, the Albion Centre Psychology Unit provides psychological support for anyone impacted by HIV who would like treatment.

All psychological treatment is free and confidential.
