BLOOD PRESSURE MEASUREMENT ON A PREGNANT WOMAN GUIDELINE

1. OPTIMAL OUTCOMES

• To accurately and consistently measure and record a blood pressure

2. PATIENT

• Pregnant women requiring assessment

3. STAFF

- Midwifery staff
- Medical staff

4. EQUIPMENT

- Sphygmomanometer
- Stethoscope
- Mercury spill kit

5. CLINICAL PRACTICE

- Position the woman, seated, with feet supported, or semi-recumbent if in bed; for 2-3 minutes
- Measure blood pressure on right arm
- Use the appropriate sized cuff; regular cuff if arm diameter is < =33cm; large cuff if >33cm
- Inflate cuff 20 mmHg above systolic pressure when felt at the brachial artery
- Deflate cuff slowly, 2mmHg per second
- Record systolic & diastolic blood pressure
- Record diastolic blood pressure at the phase V Korotkoff sound (when sounds disappear)
- Repeat reading and consult medical officer if an abnormal reading occurs
- Refer to management plan or consult medical officer if an abnormal reading occurs for an inpatient woman

6. HAZARDS/SUB-OPTIMAL OUTCOMES

• Blood pressure is measured inaccurately

7. DOCUMENTATION

- Outpatient care: antenatal notes and antenatal card
- o Inpatients: Observation sheet & integrated notes if reading abnormal

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8. EDUCATIONAL NOTES

- A mercury sphygmomanometer is the gold standard for measuring blood pressure in pregnancy and should always be used if gestational hypertension or pre-eclampsia is suspected
- Hypertension in pregnancy is diagnosed when.
 - Systolic blood pressure is >=140 mmHg
 - And/or
 - Diastolic blood pressure (Korotkoff V) is >=90 mmHg
- Blood pressure should be taken using both arms initially, then on the right arm if there is little difference between arms, if there is a significant difference, refer to the consultant physician
